



Talking about Preferences

To talk about preferences for activities, we can use the verbs *love, like or enjoy,* followed by a gerund (base verb + *-ing*). For the third person singular, we add *-s* to the preference verb.

We like watching movies.






He **enjoys** riding a bicycle.



Talking about Dislikes

To talk about dislike for activities, we use **don't like** or **doesn't like**, followed by a gerund (base verb + –*ing*). For the third person singular, we use **doesn't** before the preference verb.


We don't **like** watching movies.

To express preferences for activities we need to know:

a) Preference verbs: love – like – enjoy – dislike – hate

b) Activities (gerunds = verbs + ing): fishing, cooking, dancing, playing

c) Grammar rules:

- in positive sentences, if the person who performs the action is a **third person singluar** (any **noun** that can be sustituted by **he – she – it**) we have to add an –s at the end of the verb.

- in negative sentences, we write **don't** before the preference verb. **example: they don't like going to the cinema**

if the person who performs the action is a third person singular, we write **doesn't example: My mother doesn't like dancing tango**
